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## Practice Experience

The first step in arranging your GPP Practice Experience is getting clear with yourself about the kinds of poverty action work you are most interested in learning about at this stage in your life. Please answer the following questions to share some elements of what you are looking for in a practice experience as you prepare to join the minor. We understand your interests may change as you progress through the minor.

**1)** Poverty action takes place through many different kinds of work. These different "sectors" include public health, job development, housing, education, and environmental justice, just to name a few. What sector(s) would you like to focus your practice experience within and why? Are there particular kinds of work within these sectors (e.g. advocating policy change, developing a process or technology, evaluating the effectiveness of an intervention) that you seek to engage in?

## GPP Minor Declaration Instructions

Students interested in pursuing the Global Poverty and Practice Minor should complete this entire form, which includes the following:

- The semesters in which you plan to complete the core courses, practice experience, and directed electives for the Minor.
- Brief responses to questions regarding what type of Practice Experience (PE) you are seeking. We don't require that you have decided what you will be doing for your PE to declare the Minor. Your responses to these questions will help us advise you regarding potential options for your PE. Further discussion about the Practice Experience will take place during your Declaration Orientation.
- The course numbers and titles of two potential courses you may enroll in to fulfill each of the two elective requirements. The list of past and current approved elective courses can be downloaded from the [GPP Minor Requirements Page](#).

### Submitting the Declaration of Intent form:

The declaration deadline for Fall 2018 is **Wednesday, October 10<sup>th</sup>** and the deadline for Spring 2019 is **Wednesday, March 6<sup>th</sup>**. The Declaration of Intent form must be submitted in person to a GPP Advisor during the following drop-in advising hours:

 Tuesday, Thursday: 1:30pm - 4:00pm  
 Friday: 10:00am - 12:00pm

When submitting the declaration form, students will meet with a GPP Advisor for 5-10 minutes to discuss their responses to the questions on the form. Students are encouraged to submit their declaration of intent form at least one week in advance of this deadline to avoid long lines in the advising office.

After submitting this form, students will be invited to attend a GPP Declaration Orientation session. Attendance at one of the orientation sessions is required to complete the declaration process.
