Practice Experience

Are there particular kinds of work within this sector (e.g. advocating policy change, working with a social movement, evaluating the effectiveness of an intervention) that you seek to engage in?

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Instructions

Students interested in pursuing the Global Poverty and Practice Minor should complete this entire form, which includes the following:

- The semesters in which you plan to complete the core courses and practice experience for the Minor
- The course numbers and titles of two potential courses you may enroll in to fulfill each of the
 two elective requirements. Note that an area studies elective course must have a
 geographical connection to the location of a student's practice experience. The list of
 approved elective courses can be downloaded from the GPP Minor Requirements Page.
- Three potential organizations/projects that you may work with for your practice experience. Students will have the opportunity to research additional options for their practice experience after submitting this form. For guidance on selecting a practice experience, students should attend an "Identifying Your Practice Workshop" and meet with a GPP Advisor.

Submitting the Declaration of Intent form:

The Declaration of Intent form must be submitted in person to a GPP Advisor during the following drop-in advising hours:
