DIRECTED ELECTIVE 1: GLOBAL & AREA STUDIES

The intent of this directed elective is to train students in the geographical context in which poverty and poverty alleviation must be understood. Known as 'area studies,' such a framework encourages students to select a world-region/country in which they may wish to gain deep knowledge. An Area Studies elective must have a geographical connection to the location of a students' practice experience. For students more interested in transnational and global processes, the 'global studies' category provides an analysis of global assemblages, flows, and disjunctures.
