GPP Minor Declaration Instructions

Students interested in pursuing the Global Poverty and Practice Minor should complete this entire form, which includes the following:

- The semesters in which you plan to complete the core courses and practice experience for the Minor
- The **course numbers and titles** of two potential courses you may enroll in to fulfill each of the two elective requirements. Note that an area studies elective course must have a geographical connection to the location of a student's practice experience. The list of approved elective courses can be downloaded from the <u>GPP Minor Requirements Page</u>.
- Brief responses to questions regarding what type of Practice Experience you are seeking. Further discussion about the Practice Experience will take place during your GPP Orientation.

Submitting the Declaration of Intent form:

The declaration deadline for Spring 2014 is **Wednesday**, **AUFW**[•])th. The Declaration of Intent form must be submitted in person to a GPP Advisor during the following drop-in advising hours:

When submitting the declaration form, students will meet with a GPP Advisor for 5-10 minutes to discuss their responses to the questions on the form. Students are encouraged to submit their declaration of intent form at least one week in advance of this deadline to avoid long lines in the advising office.

After submitting this form, students will be invited to attend a GPP orientation session. Attendance at one of the orientation sessions is required to complete the declaration process.
